The gallery occupies little more than the entrance hall and stairwell of an anonymous Bethnal Green building (Tillmans's studio is on first floor), but it's where we head to check out hip US collectives or obscure German typographers we didn't know we needed to know about. The bias here is towards art with a political stance. Yet Tillmans's eye for a great image ensures that the offerings are always as engaging as they are edgy.
